

<u>Goat/Input Distribution Programme under</u> <u>DAPSC organized on 07.03.2024</u>





On 07.03.2024, goat/input distribution programme under DAPSC was organized by ICAR-NIFMD-International Centre for Foot and Mouth Disease at its campus. The programme was conducted with a long term vision for upliftment of scheduledcaste community. In this programme, Director of the institute Dr. R.P. Singh, Scientist In-Charge Dr.

Sahoo highlighted on the goat value chain and its potential on earning livelihood. During the programme a total of 45beneficiaries from SC community of Rengala GP and Ghanipur GP from Delang block of Puri district received a total of 45 female goats and 7 kids

along with mineral mixture packets. Prior to distribution, the goats were vaccinated against PPR at the door steps of the farmers from whom the goats were procured. During the programme, leaflets highlighting facts on goathusbandry and Foot and mouth disease were distributed to all the participants. The entire programme was much appreciated. Under DAPSC, the institute has been taking a serious concern and all the scientists are involved in the same so as to be a part of the mission of upliftment of SC community. Periodical health camp is planned to be organized.
